

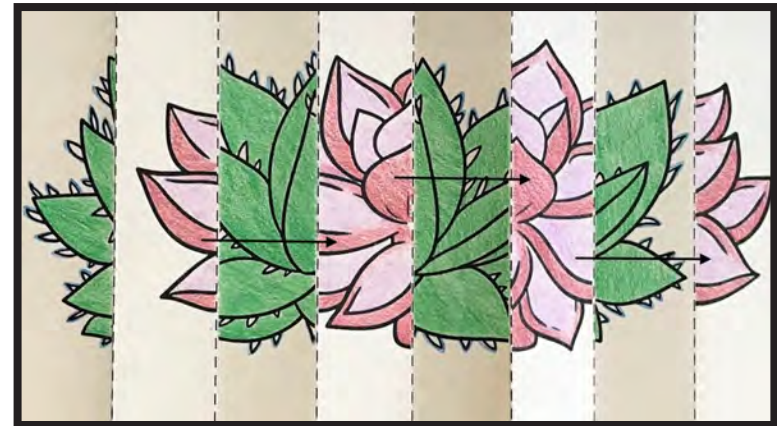
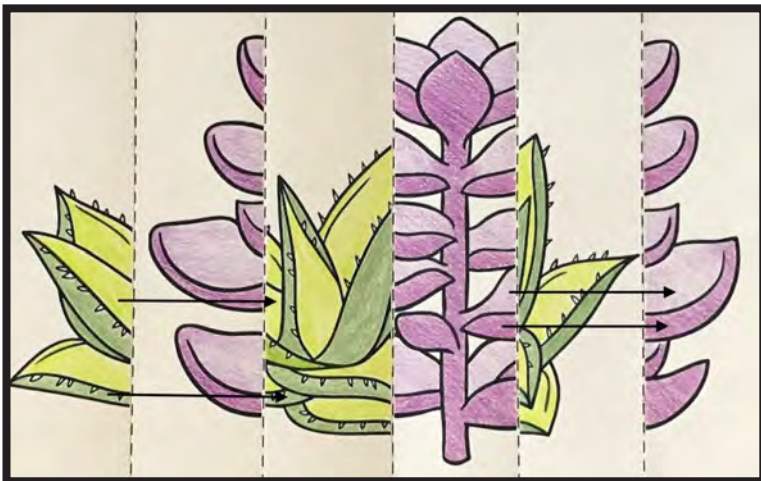
Succulent Agamographs

Do you know what an **agamograph** is? It's a set of images that change when viewed from different angles. This optical illusion is named after Yaacov Agam, an Israeli sculptor known for his optical and kinetic art. Follow the instructions below to create a mind-bending art project featuring succulents.

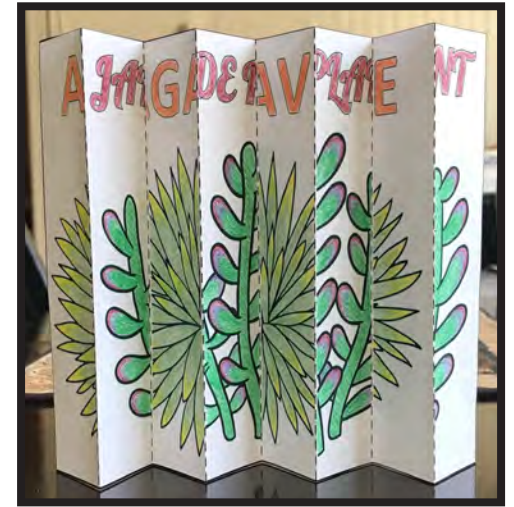
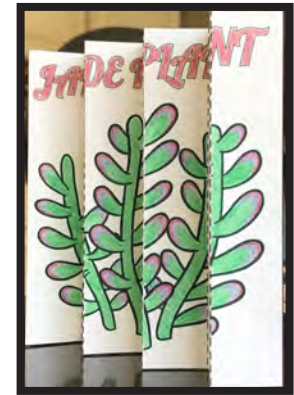


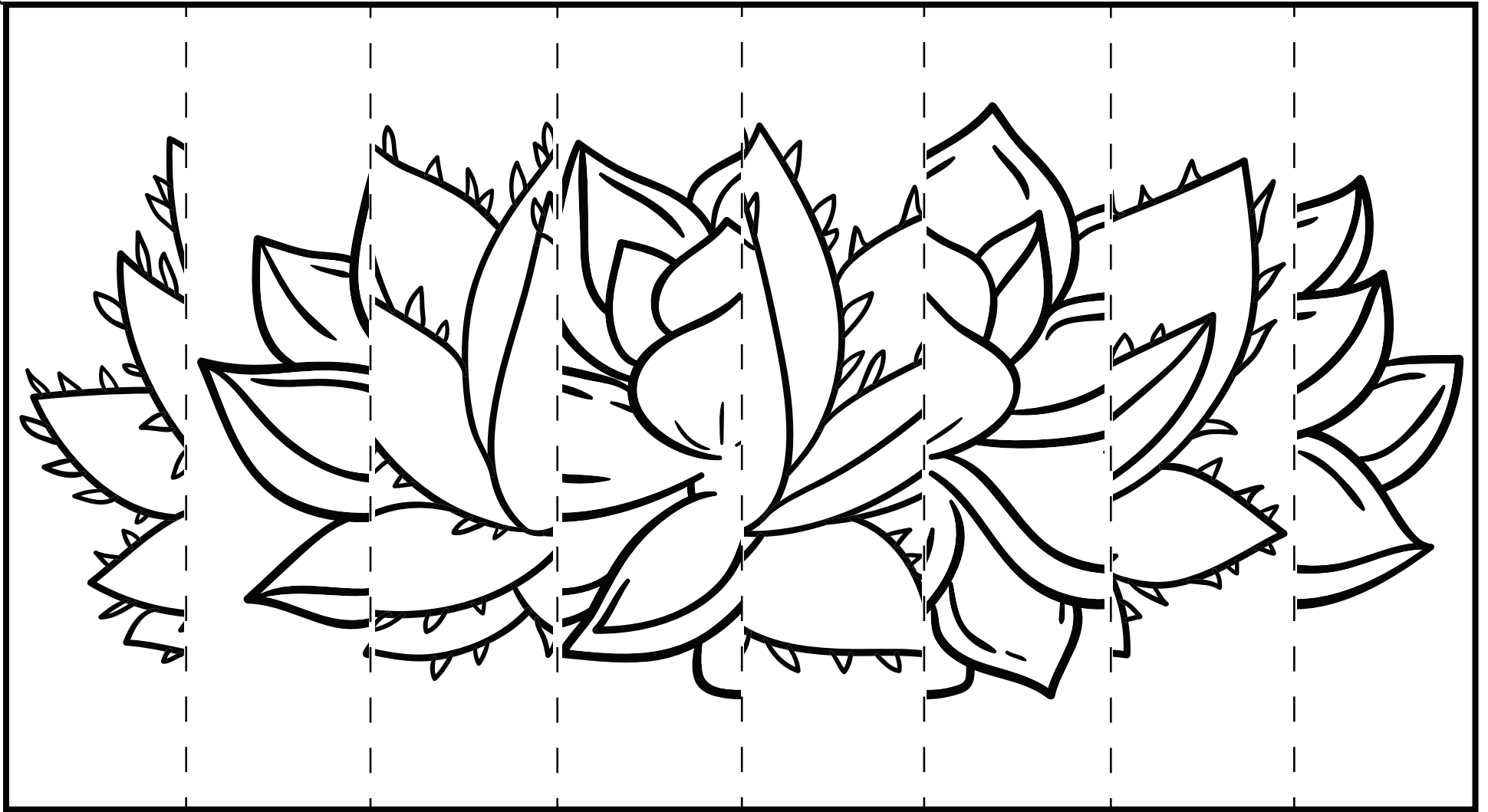
Instructions

1. Print the agamograph coloring pages. Each page has two pictures arranged in alternating panels. The first picture is labeled **1** and the second is labeled **2**.
2. Color each rectangle labeled **1** using similar colors. Make sure that the colors you use line up on each panel (see pictures).
3. Color each rectangle labeled **2** using different colors than **1**. Again, try to line up the colors on each panel.



4. Once your agamograph is colored, use scissors to cut along the solid black line.
5. Fold your agamograph like an accordion in a zig-zag, back and forth pattern.
6. Slightly unfold your agamograph and set it on a table or other flat surface. Walk around the picture from left to right and watch as it changes from one image to another.
